LLOYD'S ELECTRONIC CARGO CERTIFICATES FACILITY

As mentioned in our bulletin Y3072, the Certificates office within the Agency Department at Lloyd's provides a facility to enable policy-holders, underwriters, brokers and their clients to issue Lloyd's Marine Certificates of Insurance by electronic means. This has been achieved using a web-based system called the Genoa System in co-operation with Oceanwide.com and can be accessed at www.cargocerts.lloyds.com.

With immediate effect all covers submitted for entry onto the electronic scheme will incur a £500.00 administration charge to cover the Certificate Office's costs in preparing policy data for entry on the electronic system. Thereafter a charge of £1.50 per certificate will be made for each certificate created using the electronic system which compares favourably with the Certificate office's current charge of £2.00 per certificate produced by conventional means.

All enquiries on the electronic certificate's facility or its pricing structure should be directed in the first instance to the Certificates Office.
