What you need to know

In its <u>2023 provincial budget</u>, the Newfoundland and Labrador (NL) government has announced that it will permanently remove the retail sales tax on personal property insurance, effective April 6, 2023. This change is retroactive to April 7, 2022.

This measure affects also policies issued under the pre-authorized payment plan (PPP).
